A tax rate of \$0.069618 per \$100 valuation has been proposed by the governing body of Brazos County Emergency Services District #4.

PROPOSED TAX RATE \$0.069618 per \$100 NO-NEW-REVENUE TAX RATE \$0.051693 per \$100 VOTER-APPROVAL TAX RATE \$0.070458 per \$100

The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2024 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for Brazos County Emergency Services District #4 from the same properties in both the 2023 tax year and the 2024 tax year.

The voter-approval rate is the highest tax rate that Brazos County Emergency Services District #4 may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate.

The proposed tax rate is greater than the no-new-revenue tax rate. This means that Brazos County Emergency Services District #4 is proposing to increase property taxes for the 2024 tax year.

A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED TAX RATE WILL BE HELD ON September 18, 2024 AT 5:45 PM AT Brushy Creek Fire Station, 6357 Raymond Stotzer Parkway, College Station, TX 77845.

The proposed tax rate is not greater than the voter-approval tax rate. As a result, Brazos County Emergency Services District #4 is not required to hold an election at which voters may accept or reject the proposed tax rate. However, you may express your support for or opposition to the proposed tax rate by contacting the members of the of Brazos County Emergency Services District #4 at their offices or by attending the public hearing mentioned above.
